Assistant Commissioner Brenda Lucki joined the RCMP in 1986 and has since served in "C", "O" "D", "K" and "F" Divisions. She also served in the former Yugoslavia and assisted in training and selecting police units for the United Nations Civilian Police Mission in Haiti. She then spent three years as an Applied Police Sciences instructor at the RCMP Academy "Depot" Division.

Brenda holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Alberta and is the recipient of the United National Force Commander's Commendation for Bravery, the St. John's Ambulance Humanitarian Award, two United Nations Protection Forces Medals, the Canadian Peacekeeping Service Medal, the RCMP Commanding Officer's Commendation for her work at the G8 Summit in Kananaskis, the Commemorative Saskatchewan Centennial Medal and the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal. She is also a Member of the Order of Merit of the Police Forces in recognition of her commitment to improve the relations with the First Nations people as the Officer in Charge of the North District in "D" Division.
